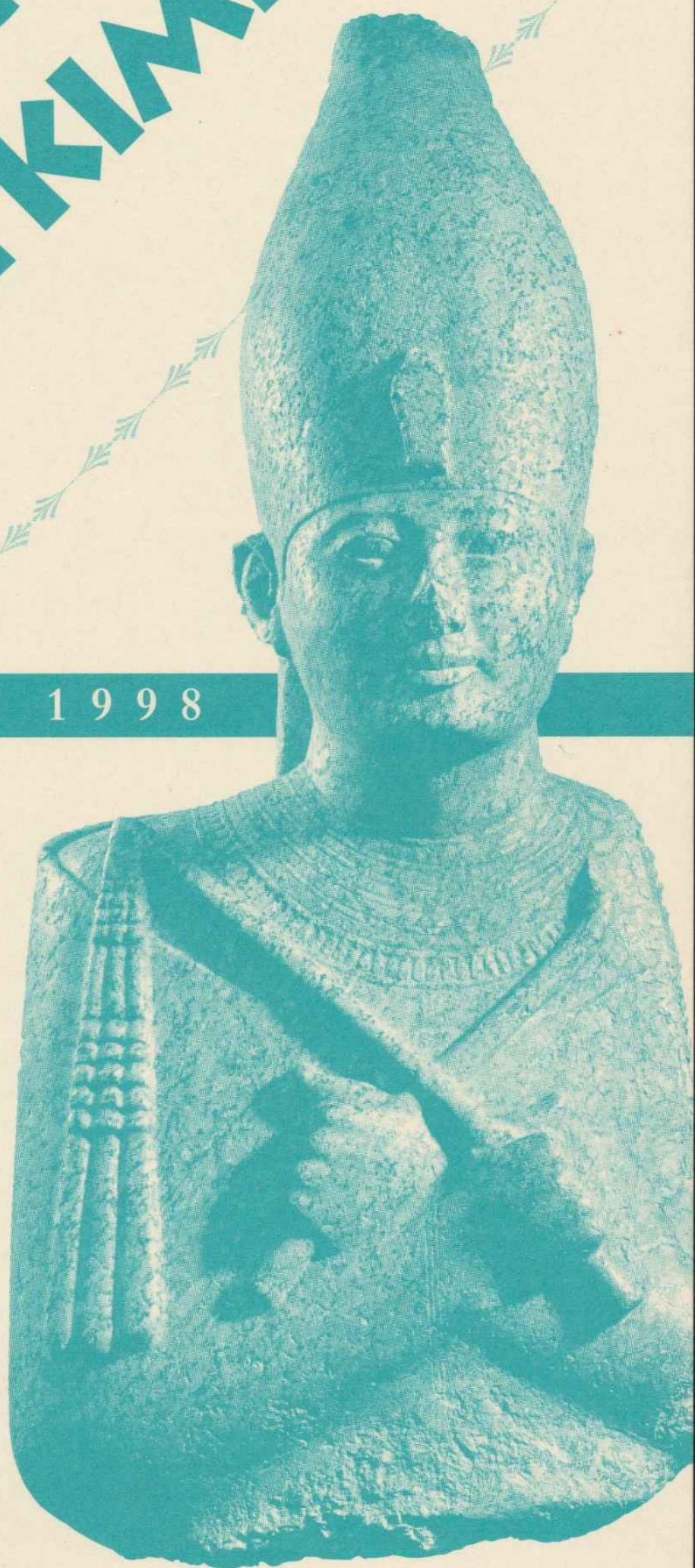

## FRIDAY WORKSHOP

October 9 *Kings, Courtiers, and Rulers at the Kimbell*  
November 13 *Feat of Clay: Masterpieces from the Mayan  
Jungles to the Plains of China*

Have you ever dreamed of spending an afternoon in a beautiful art museum exploring its treasures, then creating a masterpiece of your own? The popular Friday Workshops offer just such opportunities to adults of all ages. This fall, the series will give participants the chance to delve into the Kimbell Art Museum's world-recognized permanent collection.

How do you portray the might and majesty of a king? In the first workshop, we will encounter awe-inspiring images of power, including an Egyptian pharaoh, an African chieftain, a Flemish count, and a Spanish knight. In November, we will examine ceramics, one of the oldest and most enduring art forms, from Mayan vessels to Chinese vases and Japanese jars. Participants view a slide or video presentation, receive a tour of the Kimbell collection, and experiment with a related art project. The afternoon of new ideas and lively discussion includes a light snack in The Buffet. The materials fee for each session is \$6 (\$4 for Kimbell members). Registration, accompanied by payment, is by mail using the attached form.

There is no charge for this program, other than the price of admission to the special exhibitions.
